Assessment is ongoing via coursework related written assessments, presentations and questions.

You will be required to study English and Maths alongside your Progression course.

Our Access HE Diplomas will help you to achieve the required UCAS Tariff points to progress to Higher Education. The Diplomas consist of a range of subject sets that could be Biology, Health, Study Skills, Psychology, Chemistry or Physics.

The structure of the Diplomas varies to allow you to choose the one that will meet the requirements of your preferred pathway and HE expectations.

The Access course also enables you to be prepared for the demands of HE with expectations for the development of high levels of academic skills, research and self-directed study.

Internal assessment methods are varied and there are no external exams.

Students achieving a L3 Diploma can also progress to higher level apprenticeships and employment in the health and social care sector.
